## GENERAL INFORMATION

### HERE'S HOW TO ENTER

1. Pick up an entry form and drop off completed entry form at the following locations
  - MRSC office Mollison St, Kyneton
  - Kyneton Library, behind Kyneton Mechanics Institute, Mollison St., Kyneton
2. Enter online via [www.khs1894.com](http://www.khs1894.com)
3. No entry fee for exhibits

### CLOSE OF ENTRY DATE AND TIME

- All entries must be received no later than midday Thursday 18<sup>th</sup> April 2024
- **No late entries will be accepted.**

### INFORMATION FOR EXHIBITORS

All exhibits except Floral Art must be grown by exhibitor

Pavilion will be opened for receiving and staging exhibits

- Friday between 5pm and 7pm and
- Saturday between 8am and 10am.

Limited supply of green bottles and cones available

Each container shall have a minimum of 3 stems unless otherwise specified

**SS** = Staged Singly

Where possible naming of blooms would be appreciated

Dahlia definitions - classifications are diameter size

- Medium                      Not less than 160mm or more than 210mm
- Small                         Not less than 120mm or more than 160mm
- Pompon                      Under 50mm

### PRIZE MONEY AND RIBBONS

- Only 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> place cards will be awarded in all classes except Floral Art
- 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> place cards and prize money will be awarded in Floral Art
- Floral Art prize money will be paid on Sunday afternoon

### CUT FLOWERS AND SHRUBS

## POT PLANTS

Exhibitor must be able to carry/stage their own exhibit without assistance

- Plastic pots should not be visible when exhibiting Pot Plants, Cactus and Succulents
  - Space allowed for each exhibit is approximately 60cm except for Maiden hair ferns

  48. maiden hair fern in a pot
  49. any other fern in a pot
  50. pot of plant in bloom
  51. pot of plants in bloom
  52. plant/s in an unusual container
  53. bonsai plant

## CACTI AND SUCCULENTS

54. pot of cactus (off shoots permitted)
55. pot of succulents (off shoots permitted)
56. container of multiple planting cactus
57. container of multiple planting succulents

## SPECIAL INTEREST

58. anything of horticultural interest NOT listed – space allowed 90cm
59. **NEW** - garden scavenger hunt in a shoe box. What can you find laying around in your garden, leaves, sticks, seed pods, litter, broken china, rusty trimmers ..... use your imagination! No eggs, endangered plants or live creatures

## FLORAL ART

- Bench space allowed for each exhibit is **75cm**.
- Any plant material, based, drapes or accessories may be used.
