Section A - DAHLIAS

- ▶ Dahlia definitions - classifications are diameter size
 - Medium - Not less than 160mm or more than 210mm
 - Small - Not less than 120mm or more than 160mm
 - Pompon - Under 50mm

Class 3	Three medium dahlias, one variety in one container
Class 4	One small cactus dahlia

Class 9	Container of dahlias; not listed

Section E - POT PLANTS

- ▶ Exhibitor must be able to carry/stage their own exhibit without assistance
- ▶ Plastic pots should NOT be visible when exhibiting Pot Plants
- ▶ Space allowed for each exhibit is approximately 60cm, except for Maiden hair ferns

- ▶ Plastic pots should NOT be visible when exhibiting Pot Plants
- ▶ Bench space allowed for each exhibit is 60cm.

Section L - CHILDREN'S SECTION

- ▶ Exhibitors age MUST be shown on entry
- ▶ Entries must be staged at the same time as the general show
- ▶ Horticultural materials may include: flowers, leaves, seeds, pods, twigs, weathered wood, fruit, vegetables, berries and may be fresh or dried
- ▶ No eggs, endangered plants or live creatures
